<i>Agor</i>	A special women garments design
<i>Aronai</i>	Traditional scarf of the Bodo people
<i>Asan</i>	Bracelets worn by the Bodo women
<i>Amthisua</i>	Agricultural festival observed in the month of Ashara (Assamese month)
<i>Ashansuri</i>	Bracelet
<i>Atmangal</i>	Post marriage ceremony
<i>Ba</i>	Five
<i>Bwisagu</i>	A spring festival observed in the middle of April month
<i>Barlampha</i>	A male member who leads by carrying two earthen pitchers during the marriage ceremony
<i>Biban</i>	Two earthen pitchers which consist of tea, sugar, rice etc.
<i>Dahra</i>	Bamboo mate
<i>Daodab or Ogdab</i>	An wood fire stove plastering with mud
<i>Dokohna</i>	Traditional dress wear by the Bodo women
<i>Don</i>	Bamboo basket
<i>Duli</i>	Bamboo bigger basket
<i>Doudhini</i>	A female exorcist
<i>Dwisarnai</i>	Ritual of sprinkling holy water
<i>Dwori</i>	A specific male member who help he priest during the religious functions

<i>Emao</i>	A cake made of herbal useful to prepare wine
<i>Fathaifesinai</i>	An act of tearing betel leaf during the time of divorce between Bodo couple
<i>Ficha</i>	Son
<i>Gambari kampli</i>	A wooden stool
<i>Gisib</i>	Fan made of bamboo
<i>Gwrjia Haba</i>	Matrilocal marriage where the bridegroom resides at the house of bride
<i>Haba</i>	Marriage
<i>Indi</i>	Eri tree
<i>Jougisi</i>	Rice beer
<i>Jougwrn</i>	Fermented wine
<i>Jotha</i>	Cymbals
<i>Kada</i>	Bamboo basket
<i>Kathi Gasasaonai</i>	Lightening of earthen lamp in the paddy field in the month of Karthik
<i>Kham</i>	Long drum
<i>Laru</i>	Lumpish made of rice floor
<i>Mainao</i>	Goddess of wealth
<i>Mairong</i>	Rice grains
<i>Mwi</i>	Harrow
<i>Na</i>	Fish
<i>Napam</i>	One kind of food prepared from dried fish kept in the bamboo pipe for some months
<i>Noma No</i>	Main house

<i>Oja</i>	A priest
<i>Oma</i>	Pig
<i>Onlawankri</i>	A traditional cuisine of the Bodos
<i>Pathwi</i>	Betel leaf
<i>Phuthuli Haba</i>	Doll marriage
<i>Sijou</i>	Euphorbia splendens
<i>Siphung</i>	Flute
<i>Serja</i>	A kind of musical instrument similar to a Violin
<i>Thulsi</i>	Basel shrub
