2. Write answer to the following questions: (any three)      8 x 3=24
  - (a) Critically comment on the romantic plot of Ona and Nwokocho Agbadi.
  - (b) Give thematic analysis of the African poems "An African Elegy" and "Elegy for Alto".
  - (c) Discuss critically the role of Azaro, a Spirit Child narrator in maintaining link of the episodic narratives of *Infinite Riches*.
  - (d) Evaluate the importance of songs used in *The Trial of Dedan Kimathi*.
